To provide pupils with a designated member of staff to deliver high quality PE lessons.	September 2019	Pupils will improve their core abilities of movement, co-ordination, balance and fitness through sports specific activities and competitions. Pupils will continue to be exposed to non-performance-based content.	100% of pupils have accessed a variety of PE lessons that focused on improving core movements and skills alongside identified fundamental movements. Key Stage 3 and 4 pupils have PE lessons taught by subject specialists. In particular all Key Stage 2 pupils received weekly lessons by a qualified PE specialist.
To utilise Amber Valley SSP staff to assist in the facilitation of PE lessons at KS3	September 2019	Pupils will continue to have access to high quality provision during lessons.	A member of the Amber Valley SSP staff assisted in the facilitation of KS3 PE lessons. This enabled class sizes of ~15 pupils to be maintained for this particularly large Key stage. This reduction in class sizes enabled high quality

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			teaching to take place. Participation within Key Stage 3 PE lessons was particularly high, at over 95%
Hiring of sports halls/facilities and venues. To enable the delivery of sports specific PE lessons and whole school interhouse activities for pupils of SSSC. To provide and facilitate high quality special school specific events for federation partners, such as the SSSC gym and dance display, SEN football festivals and Paralympic events at Derby Velodrome.	September 2019 – July 2020	<p>To provide pupils with facilities that enables them to access different sports and further develop their sports specific skills and fundamental movements.</p> <p>To provide SEN pupils within the federation the opportunity to participate in meaningful competition and events with peers from differing schools.</p>	<p>Access to specialist facilities has resulted in pupils improving their sports specific performances. This was particularly noticeable in Basketball sessions (which were not available at SSSC).</p> <p>Due to the Covid-19 outbreak, the SSSC gym and dance display and Velodrome Paralympic event were cancelled. SSSC was able to host a SEN football festival using the AWP which was attended by 5 schools.</p>
Access to sports specific CPD through appropriate NGB's for staff that are involved in leading or supporting PE lessons.	October 2019	Pupils will have access to higher quality of lesson due to staff having a greater experience on how to facilitate and lead different activities.	3 members of the SSSC staff completed an LTA accredited course to enable the greater teaching of Tennis. This enabled Tennis lessons to be enhanced, and progress supported by a number of staff members.

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Maintaining and updating sports specific equipment to ensure all lessons have the appropriate number and quality required.	October 2019	Pupils will have regular opportunities to improve their fundamental skills through play or directed lesson time with specialised equipment.	Regularly used PE equipment was subject to annual maintenance. This included the trampoline, benches and mats.
Transport costs.	September 2019 - June 2020	Use of a local coach company to assist pupils in accessing sports specific venues for all sports activities where relevant.	Transport has enabled pupils to access specialist venues and activities for lessons and competitions.
